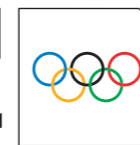

The first Winter Olympics in Asia!

The 4th Gangwon Winter Youth Olympic Games will be held in Gangwon Special Self-Governing Province, Republic of Korea. Gangwon Special Self-Governing Province has already hosted the 2018 Pyeongchang Winter Olympic Games. The 2024 Gangwon Winter Youth Olympic Games, the first in Asia, will be held based on the legacy of Pyeongchang 2018, and is looking forward to the active participation of the youth through various activities that will be held before, during, and after the Olympic Games.

- Host City** 4 cities in Gangwon special self-governing province (Gangneung, PyeongChang, Hoengseong, Jeongseon)
- Participants** Approx. 15,000 people in total from over 80 countries (athletes: 1,900)

Gangwon 2024 Winter Youth Olympic Games (January 19-February 1, 2024) will feature moving performances by youth from the host country and around the world and by the general public, as well as special exhibitions featuring disabled youth from home and abroad. Gangneung Art Center's Saimdang Hall will host a variety of cultural and artistic performances led by 7 performing groups of

the best artists in Korea, while two exhibition halls will showcase works created by disabled artists from 2 different groups. Experience the charm of Gangwon's culture and arts through K-POP concerts and K-CULTURE festivals representing K-content at the Pyeongchang Dome and the Gangneung Kwandong University Ice Hockey Center.

2024 Dream Orchestra Gangneung <Gathering Hopes and Dreams>

"Dream Orchestra Gangneung" and the "Gangneung Angels Choir" will gather hopes and dreams of children and adolescents through their music, wishing for the successful hosting of the Gangwon 2024 Winter Youth Olympic Games. Listen to the collaborative spirit and unity of their performances as the beautiful melodies of the "Dream Orchestra Gangneung" and the radiant harmonies of the "Gangneung Angels Choir" come together.

Korea National Contemporary Dance Company (Jan. 23, 2024 <Tue.> 19:30)



Korea National Contemporary Dance Company's HIP 合 program, themed on cross-genre collaboration, will feature two works: <Breaking> by choreographer Lee Kyung-eun, which has been praised for its energetic collaboration between street dance, traditional Korean music, and contemporary dance, and <Unprotected> by choreographer Jung Cheol-in, which incorporates outstanding object utilization and powerful movements.

The New Year, New Energy & New Generation

Korean National Symphony Orchestra (Jan. 25, 2024 <Thu.> 19:30)



"The concert will begin with the overture of Johann Strauss II's "Die Fledermaus," a representative classical work that announces the "New Year," and "The Skater's Waltz" by Waldteufel, a work that expresses skating, one of the winter Olympic events. Focusing on the Youth Olympics, splendid violin concerto "Fantasy on Themes from Gounod's 'Faust', Op.20" by Wieniawski, will be performed in collaboration with Kim Seo-hyun, a promising violin prodigy in the classical music field. Finally, Tchaikovsky's Nutcracker Suite will be played, decorating the end of the performance with a variety of rhythms and colors of music including various national dance songs.

Joyful Choral Journey

National Chorus of Korea (Jan. 26, 2024 <Fri.> 19:30)



The National Chorus of Korea, which has showcased the diverse charms of choral singing by presenting a variety of genres from Korean songs to pop songs, operas, and musicals, will present a <Joyful Choral Journey> with beautiful harmonies and lyrical piano melodies. Let us get excited about the beautiful music that will weave through the night sky of Gangneung on January 26th.

<Opera Journey> in Collaboration with Korea National Opera

Korea National Opera (Jan. 27, 2024 <Sat.> 17:00)



In celebration of the Lunar Year of the Dragon in 2024 and the Winter Youth Olympic Games held in Gangneung, we present <Opera Journey> in collaboration with the Korea National Opera on stage. The first part of the concert will kick off with the lively waltz-style overture of Johann Strauss II's <The Blue Danube>, followed by major arias and duets from three operettas by Franz Lehár including <The Merry Widow> and <The Land of Smiles>. The second part will feature familiar opera arias to create a classical concert that is approachable for audiences.

Traditional Dance & Traditional Performance

Korea National University of Arts (Jan. 29, 2024 <Mon.> 19:30)



A performance where you can enjoy the essence of Korean traditional arts will be presented. The unique stage with deeply embedded Korean sentiment, such as the fan dance with its gentle curves and yin-yang harmony depicted through both hands, the Gyeonggi Dodanggut performed to pray for the village's well-being and harvest to the Dodangshin, and the Taepyeongmu which celebrates the nation's harvest and the peace, will provide an opportunity to enjoy the charm of K-culture that is quintessentially Korean and global at the same time.

Ballet with Commentary Le Corsaire

Korean National Ballet (Jan.31, 2024 <Wed.> 19:30)



"Le Corsaire", classic ballet masterpiece has been adapted with a commentary by "King Magentos" to make it more accessible and enjoyable for people of all ages and genders. Korean National Ballet's "Le Corsaire" is a story of the friendship between pirates Conrad, Ali, and Birbanto, as well as of the innocent love between Conrad and Florian island girl Medora. The 2020 version, re-choreographed by soloist Song Jung-bin, features dynamic group dances and spectacular techniques for the audience to enjoy.

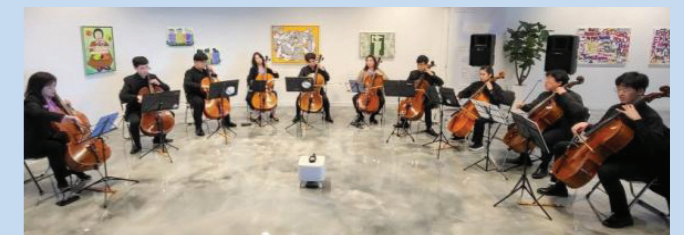
Friends of People with Disabilities and the Five Continents (Jan. 19 – Feb. 1, 2024)



"Art Olympic Project" will bring together young artists with developmental disabilities from around the world just as Gangwon 2024 Winter Youth Olympic Games unites youth through sports. What makes this exhibition special is that it showcases 100 works of art from five continents—Africa, Asia, Europe, America, and Australia—and features a 100-meter painting by artist Kim Geun-tae as well as video media works, making it an 'Art Project' that captures global attention.

Together We Shine: Special Exhibition of Art Brut

Art Brut Korea (Jan. 19 – Feb. 1, 2024)



"Art Brut" is the artistic expression of artists with developmental disabilities. Artists with developmental disabilities have demonstrated exceptional talent in the field of art, and their activities as painters are particularly prominent. Art is essential to humans as it evokes empathy and emotion. The opening will feature a performance by the Soloist Furnière Cello Ensemble led by cellist Song Hee-song, and an exhibition of over 60 works by art brut artists. Throughout the exhibition, visitors can engage in a variety of experiences, such as caricature drawing with the artist, safari making, and woodblock printing experience.

* Wheelchair seats are 50% off the regular price (discount applicable for the wheelchair user and 1 accompanying person)

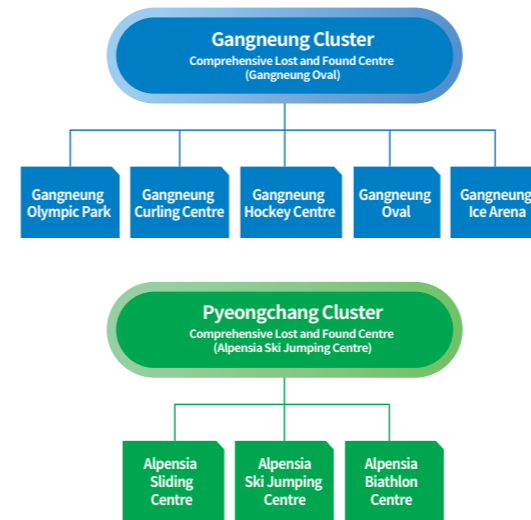

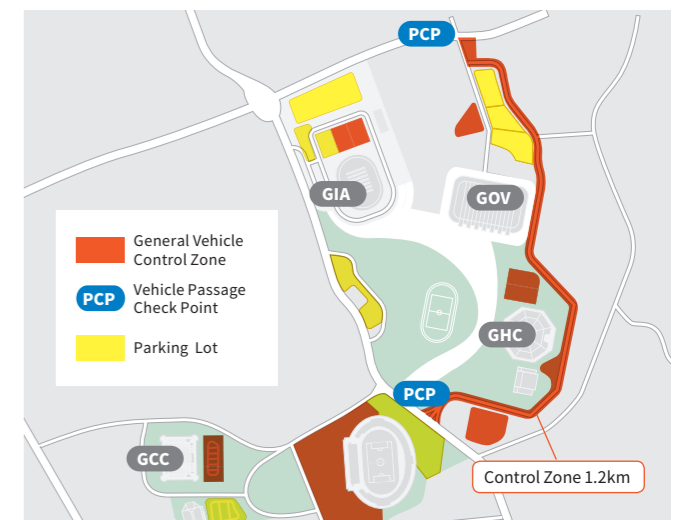

Traffic Control Zone



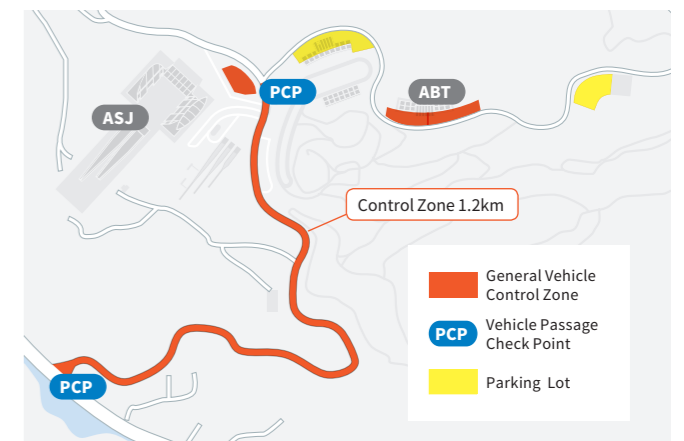

Prohibited items are subject to the principle under any circumstances, and restricted items are allowed to be brought in only under certain circumstances.

A discipline in which athletes slalom down on snow-covered slopes with their heels fixed on ski plates with bindings

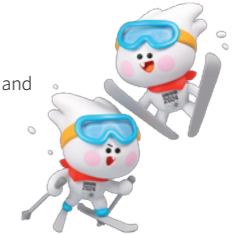
